Malaga Water District Test Well #1 Bid Award

Chelan Airport Waterline Project – Kuntz presented a draft local cost share formula between Chelan County, City of Chelan, and the Regional Port. The Board asked for additional information regarding how the water will be allocated between the airport and other uses, such as housing.

Governmental Affairs Representation – Kuntz provided an overview of the 2023 Regional Port Washington State legislative priorities and whether hiring a consultant to assist deemed necessary. The Board authorized Kuntz to issue an RFP.

Parcells Hangar/Waterville Airport – Kuntz stated the Parcells Hangar will be purchased for \$190,000 and Port of Douglas County funds will be used.

Cashmere Mill District Update – Kuntz discussed the need to obtain an NFA (No Further Action) letter from the Department of Ecology to market the center section of the Mill District previously declared surplus.

Virtower Monthly Update – Moyers presented the August 2022 Virtower report that summarizes the takeoffs and landings for Pangborn, Lake Chelan, and Mansfield Airports.

MISCELLANEOUS STAFF REPORTS:

-PFC Application for both the Taxiway A and MALSR Projects have been approved.

-Chelan Airport had their Environmental Assessment kickoff meeting.

-The Waterville Airport Lighting Project Contract has been issued to Colvico, Inc. It seems that there are some procurement issues and updates will be forthcoming.

-Airport fence repair estimate will be \$25,000. In March 2022 a vehicle drove through this portion. Russ also mentioned that this has been the 4th time this section of fence has been damaged due to vehicles.

-NCW Tech Innovator Awards Luncheon is on September 21st. Cridlebaugh mentioned that the Port has a table with 8 seats available if anyone has an interested in attending. One of the Regional Port's tenants, Streamline Fulfillment, is a finalist for Entrepreneur of the Year.

Re:	Authorization to Advertise for Bids – CTC Salvage, Demolition, and Restoration Project

At the June 14, 2022 Board of Directors meeting staff was given direction to update the bidding documents for the CTC Salvage, Demolition, and Restoration Project in order to put the project out to bid this fall. DOH Associates has completed their updates to the documents and the project is ready to bid.

The base bid consists of removal and salvage of data center equipment (including the diesel generators), demolition of data center related building improvements, replacing louvers with windows, replacing HVAC systems, restoration of electrical systems, and restoration of fire suppression/alarm systems. Three alternates are also proposed which include replacement of window perimeter sealant, replacement of deteriorated window gaskets, and restoration of the equipment yard to parking.

Below is the proposed project schedule:

Pre-Bid Meeting:	10/18/22
Bids Due:	11/2/22
Start Construction:	12/1/22
Construction Complete:	May 2023

Legal counsel has been consulted regarding the bidding documents and form of contract since we are including the salvage equipment with the construction project.

Per the attached letter from DOH Associates, they estimate the salvage equipment to be valued at \$1,184,000 and the base bid demolition and restoration work to cost \$4,170,240.

Staff is seeking Board approval to solicit bids for the CTC Salvage, Demolition, and Restoration Project.

Ladies / Gentlemen:

Separate bids were received for the salvage portion of the Subject Project when bid in September 2021. Since that time, some salvage items may have appreciated in value and others have likely depreciated. Overall, we anticipate the bid amount for salvage this fall will be in the range as bids received last year. The highest bid received was \$1,184,000.

General construction costs have sharply increased in the last year. Even though the re-bid documents have eliminated some HVAC equipment from the Project, we expect the demolition and reconstruction bid amount to exceed the \$3,200,00 bid received from Halme Builders in September 2021. The Halme Builders bid did not include Washington State Sales Tax. It has been included below. The low bid received yesterday for a simple re-bid project increased 40% over the low bid received a year ago from the same bidder. Since this project includes a substantial amount of demolition, we believe the increase will be less, and have allowed 20%.

E0104-1: Chelan, Douglas regional aquatic district

Current Law	Under current law, local governments have the authority to impose three local sales taxes to fund Public Facilities Districts (PFDs). There are certain rules and requirements for each funding option.
	The Public Facilities District tax under RCW 82.14.048 allows for a local sales and use tax. The tax rate can be up to 0.002 for public facilities districts, but a public facilities district formed under RCW 35.57.010(1)(e) may not impose the tax at a rate that exceeds 0.002 minus the rate of the highest tax imposed by any other PFDs within its boundaries.

Major port projects in Skagit and Douglas counties among six proposals approved for funding statewide

OLYMPIA, WA – The Washington State Community Economic Revitalization Board (CERB) today approved \$3,790,600 in low-interest loans and \$630,200 in grants for economic development and public infrastructure improvements in five counties. Projects awarded funding are located in Douglas, Kittitas, Lewis, Spokane, and Skagit counties and will spur business growth and job creation.

- Douglas County \$2,500,000 loan to the Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority for the "Trades District Construction Project," consisting of engineering, design, permitting and construction of 25 small industrial buildings on existing foundations, including retrofitting existing and partially completed buildings to include enclosing the building, adding a rollup door, ADA restrooms, and meeting energy standards. An estimated 75 full time jobs are expected to be created by this project. CERB funds are matched by \$8,990,967 in federal and local resources.
- Kittitas County \$50,000 grant to the Ellensburg Business Development Authority, dba Ellensburg CenterFuse for the "Wood Products Expansion Plan" to assess the need for and impact of an expanded wood products sector and the feasibility of building a wood products business park. CERB funds are matched by \$12,500 in local resources.
- Kittitas County \$50,000 grant to the Ellensburg Business Development Authority, dba Ellensburg CenterFuse for the "I-90 West Interchange Development Study." This project consists of a study to identify obstacles and opportunities for private development of undeveloped land at Ellensburg's I-90 West Interchange. CERB funds are matched by \$12,500 in local resources.
- Lewis County \$50,000 grant to the Port of Chehalis for the "Dawson Road Development Project Study" to develop plans for a multi-use commercial structure for commercial and industrial use. CERB funds are matched by \$12,500 in local resources.
- Skagit County \$1,290,600 loan and a \$430,200 grant to the Port of Skagit County for the "NW Mills Expansion Project." This project includes construction of Port-owned infrastructure, such as utilities, site work, excavation of unsuitable soils, and infill of soil materials to provide a build-ready site for Northwest Mills and Specialty Grains SPC. An estimated 34 full time jobs are expected to be created by this project. CERB funds leveraged \$21,500,000 in private investment by NW Mills and Specialty Grains SPC. CERB funds are matched by \$430,200 in local resources.
- Spokane County \$50,000 grant to the Spokane Conservation District for the "Phase 3 Scale House Market Plan," a feasibility study for the design and renovation of an existing 2,800-square-foot building to accommodate a commercial kitchen and market vendors. CERB funds are matched by \$12,500 in local resources.

"CERB was created by the Legislature 40 years ago and has earned a solid reputation for making sound investments in economic development-driven public infrastructure supporting business development and job opportunities for the citizens of our State. With today's investments CERB continues to build the economy of our local communities and contribute to the future workforce of our Washington." said CERB Chair Michael Echanove.

The release of CERB funds to these projects is contingent upon each applicant completing specific pre-contract requirements, such as finalizing other funding sources and obtaining necessary permits. Since 1982, CERB has committed nearly \$220 million to local jurisdictions across the state, an investment generating more than 39,000 jobs, and private capital investment of \$6.3 billion – a \$29-to-\$1 return on CERB investments. Read the 2020 CERB Legislative Report and the 2020 CERB Rural Broadband Legislative Report to learn more.

As Washington's strategic economic development resource, CERB is focused on creating private sector jobs in partnership with local governments by financing infrastructure improvements. These improvements encourage new business development and expansion. In addition to funding construction projects, CERB provides limited funding for studies that evaluate high-priority economic development projects.





Over the last several years, the Regional Port has encountered an increased homeless presence in the Olds Station area, including a high volume of transient motorhomes and vehicles parked long term along the roadways. This has resulted in large amounts of garbage and belongings on the sidewalks, parking areas and Regional Port owned properties.

The Regional Port has also witnessed unfavorable activities. These activities are of concern due to the nature of our business(s). The Confluence Technology Center houses multiple business tenants. We have recently lost tenants due to their concern of safety and well-being.

The Confluence Technology Center is widely recognized for its regional Videoconference and Meeting Center. Our customers have voiced how disheartening and unsettling it is to see that the area is becoming engulfed by the homeless. This is definitely not the impression we wish to portray as one drives up to the building.

CDRPA staff have put in numerous hours of after-hour call-ins, cleanup and communication with Wenatchee RiverCom and Police relating to the events listed above.

We ask that the City of Wenatchee consider our request to add 'No Overnight Parking' signs to Technology Way and Technology Center Way.

As of January 1, 2020, the Port of Chelan County and Port of Douglas County consolidated and formed an operating entity, the Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority (CDRPA). For the 2020 and 2021 calendar years, the CDRPA obtained medical benefits from Washington Counties Insurance Fund, and then joined the Health Care Authority effective January 1, 2022.

Laura Jaecks was an employee of the Port of Chelan County for approximately fifteen years, until October 31, 2018. She was not a retiree, but over the age of 55, and was informed she qualified for lifelong insurance eligibility with PEBB (per Jim Mendoza, Retirement Specialist). Due to our organizational changes, she was classified as a COBRA recipient, and is now receiving notices that her coverage will be ending as of December 31, 2022.

Laura was a long-term employee of our organization, and we support her efforts to obtain affordable health care. We are requesting that you review her history and approve life-time coverage by PEBB, at COBRA/retiree rates.
